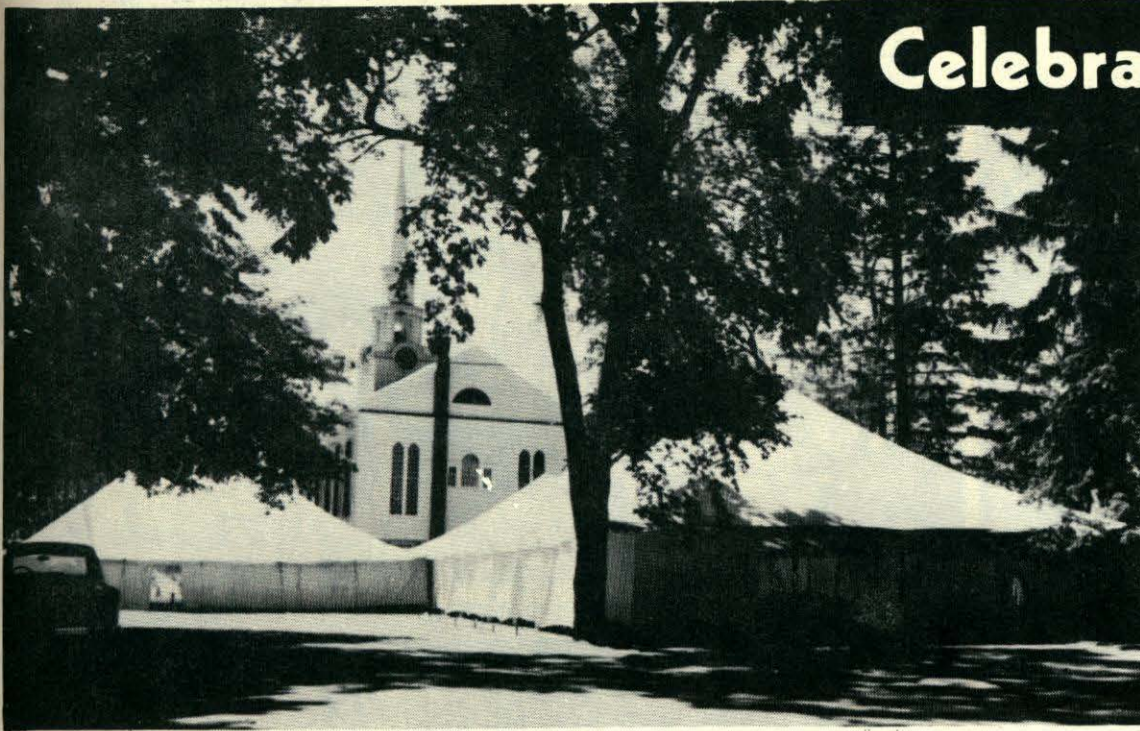

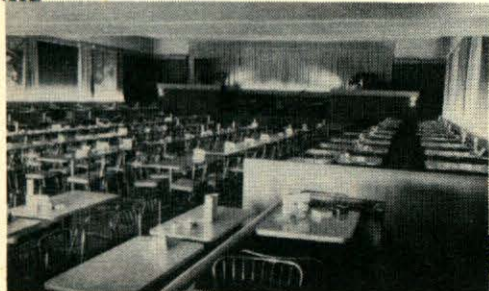

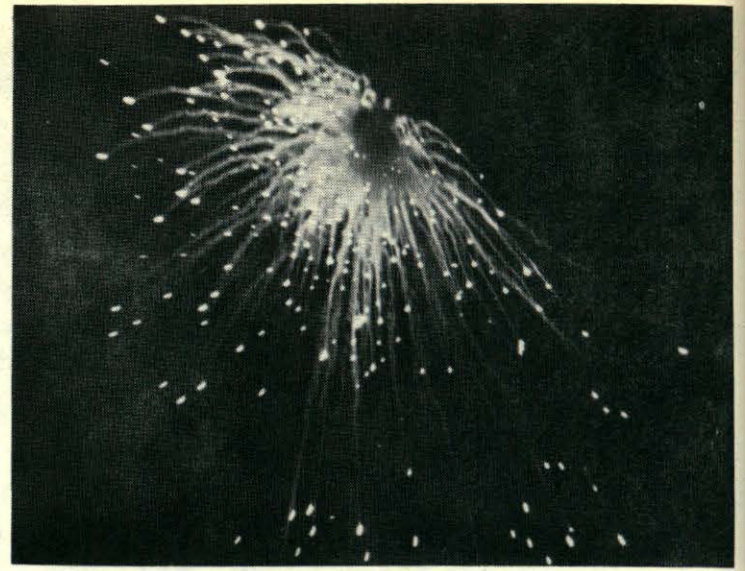

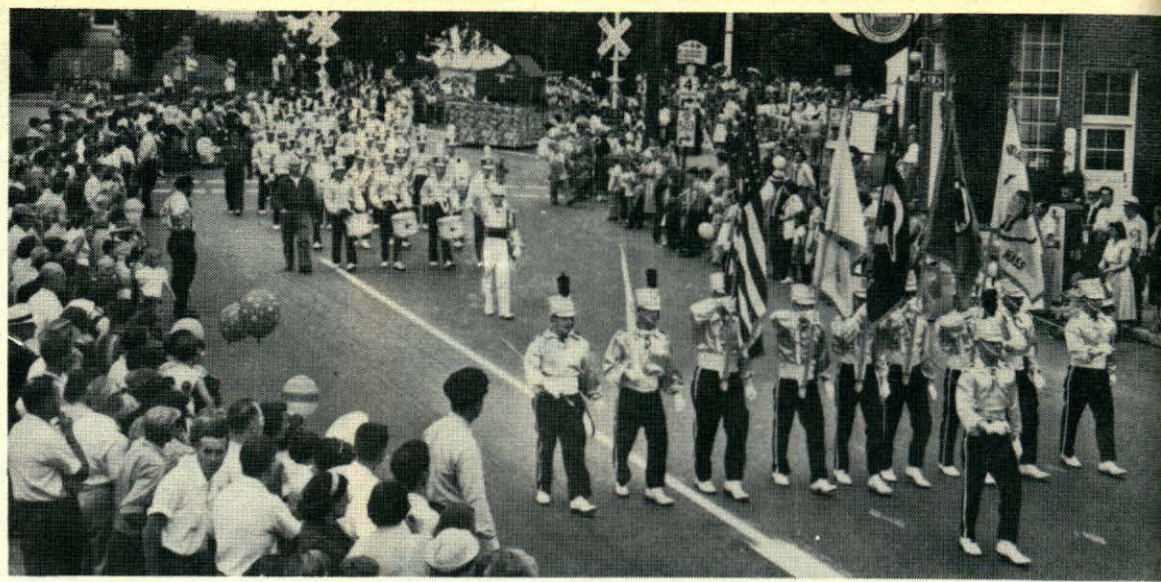

It would be remiss of me if I didn't speak right now about the Tercentenary hymn written by Mrs. Ednah Parkhurst. The music by Mr. Thompson was completely right for this beautiful poem. What I felt was the dignity of it all. The chorus was in complete accord about this because it was sung with feeling that gave the hymn a dignity that will stay, I know, with everyone who heard it, a long time.

Everyone seemed to be listening intently when this was sung and there seemed to be a feeling of reverence in the hall. For a few minutes I thought that the audience was being asked to stand, to honor both Mrs. Parkhurst and Mr. Thompson, but of course the chorus had already given them honor by their performance of this hymn.

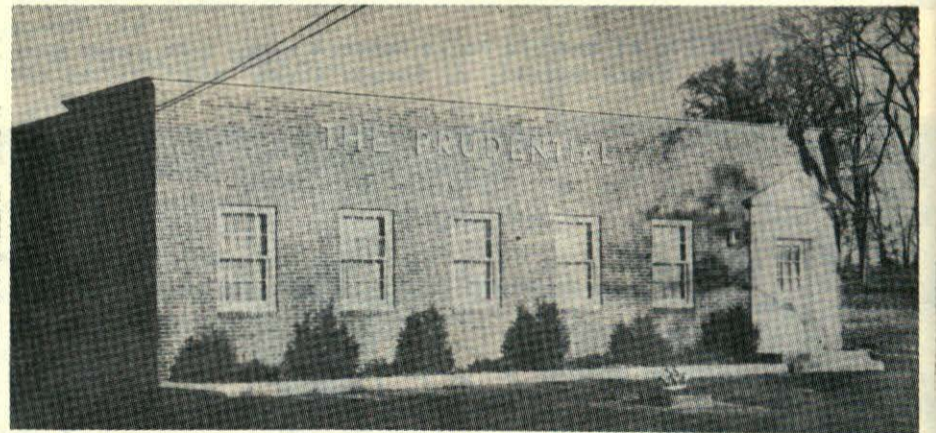

Ball, president, opened its museum in the Adams Library each afternoon during the celebration and welcomed over 300 guests who came to see a wide variety of articles pertaining to the history of Chelmsford shown in the museum and in a special exhibition in the Adams Library reading room. The latter exhibition included the original of the Tercentenary seal, drawn by Miss Kay MacElroy and presented to the Society by the Tercentenary Committee, Indian relics, hand wrought nails and hardware, curved runner skates, a sparking lamp, a copy of a 'Bible History', the lines written by the Rev. Wilson Waters on a large iron key discovered in Central Square, a sugar bowl from the Manning Tavern (later the Town Farm), tinware, and copies of many interesting papers such as a copy book, two of Rev. Ebenezer Bridge's sermons, statements of Town expenses, and copies of the

Chelmsford Eagle and Chelmsford Memorial.

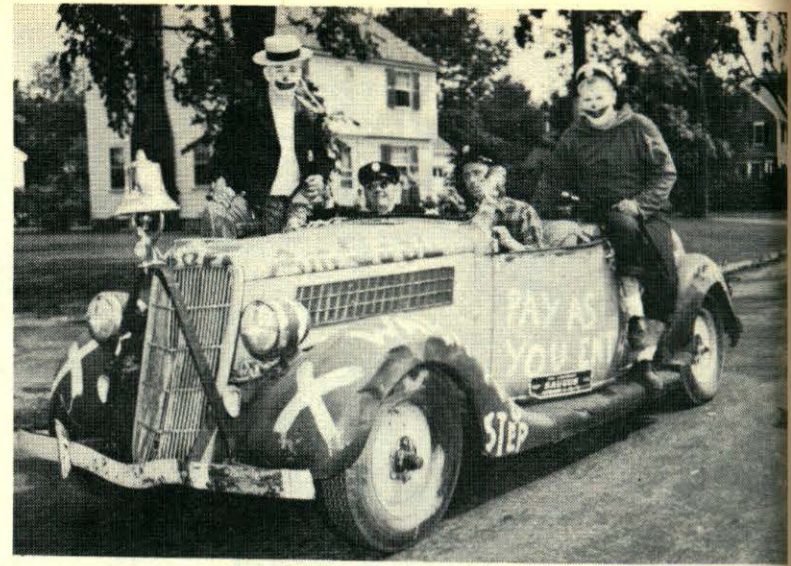

Parade Greatest Ever Here

The largest and best parade ever staged in Chelmsford was witnessed by upwards of 25,000 as estimated by Police on last Saturday morning.

There were many dignitaries on hand from both National and State levels. Gov. Christian A. Herter, Cong. Edith Nourse Rogers, Director Norman P. Mason of the Federal Housing Authority, Mayor John Janas of Lowell, and Judge John F. Valentine were some of the dignitaries on the reviewing stand along with their wives

and also members of the Tercentenary Committee.

Capt. George W. Peterson, Spanish War Veteran of Chelmsford, was Chief Marshal and led the parade following a detail of motorcycle policemen. The Board of Selectmen and Gold Star Mothers and the Billerica Board of Selectmen followed this group. Chief Ralph J. Hulslander headed a Police detail from Chelmsford next in line. Lt. Gov. Sumner Whittier and Rep. Edward J. DeSaulnier, Jr. were next in

the marching line.

Chief of Staff Edgar Gilet led the next division which was made up of the Army Band some marching Army units, the Navy Reserve unit, and the National Guard headed by Capt. John Cooney of Chelmsford. A group of National Guard 'ducks' was headed by Capt. Edward Fabbri, also of Chelmsford. Several Legion units were also

in this division.

The next division was headed by the newly formed Police Band and included the Tercentenary Queen Miss Betty Lee Morrison on a float. This division included the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Little Leaguers, Lions Club, Silver Spurs Horse Club, St. John's Holy Name society, and many floats. There was also a group of old style as well as modern

sports cars.

The Fire Department division was headed by Fire Chief Allen Kidder and included many pieces of both modern equipment and old hand tubs used in the muster. Two large marching units included the Fire Department force, all smartly dressed, and a large group from Somerville. The old town hearse drew up the rear and was appropriately marked 'The End.'
