ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

This structure is a 29' by 24' four square with a low pitched gable roof placed about 12' from the street on 3760 sq. ft. of land. The roof has asphalt shingles with a brick chimney located in the center of the rear side roof making it not visible from the street. The building is clad in clapboards and all windows are flat trimmed 2/1 with recent storm windows. The house has wide eves and corner posts on all corners. The structure sits on a mortared fieldstone foundation with the bulkhead located in the south west section of the west wall.

The front of the house faces the south. The paneled front door with glass windows and a small pair of rectangular transom lights over the door is protected by a Greek Rival style door hood with the gable end facing the street. The hood has a typical molded gable and return trim forming the arch. The front face board of the arch is plain with a shallow arch. The hood is supported by a pair of simple brackets. West of the front door is a single window with a pair of shutters. In the second floor facade are2 evenly spaced windows across the wall.

The west side of the building has 2 evenly spaced windows on each floor.

The north side (rear) of the building has a pair of matching single windows on the west end of the wall directly in line with the other on the first and second floors. In the east section of the same wall on the first floor is a smaller casement style coupled window.

The east side of the building has an attached 6' by 19' single story screened porch with a hip roof, molded fascia boards and square pillar corner posts to the rail and then square corner pots to the floor. Screens on the upper 2/3 and clapboard siding on the lower 1/4 of the walls. The rear wall of the porch has a door with a set of wooden stairs with square posts to the yard. The porch has a crawl space protected by a wall of wooden lattice. The building wall within the porch has a center door with a glass

window in the upper half of the door. Immediately to the south of the door is a small paned window. There are two full sized windows on opposite ends of the wall. The second floor has a window directly on the northeast corner of the house and another south of the midline of the wall.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

D The history of the house begins with the public auction purchase of 1.25 acres of land by Frank G. Pratt, the foreman of loom harness factory in Lowell. In 1889,Mr. Pratt built a paint shop south of his home on the land to become 29 Acton Road. From this shop, Frank resumed with his 3 sons carriage and house painting. Over the years, Frank developed an elastic oil based paint that became very popular in this area. The 1909 deed does note the existence of a building (recorded as being built in 1866) located on the property. By 1890, Frank had built the paint shop on the future 29 Acton Road location. Frank was very civic oriented. Local papers report he was a member of the Knights of Columbus, attended town meetings, was appointed to the town jury pool and participated in forums to promote business.

During 1909, Nora L. Pratt, Frank's wife acquired the 1.25 acre lot on Acton Road. In 1916, Nora Pratt filed a plan of land in the Middlesex North Registry of Deeds subdividing the property into 3 lots. The lot noted as #3 became 29 Acton Road. The Lowell Courier Citizen on May 5, 1916, "A cellar for a house to be erected for J. H. Pratt(son) is being dug in Acton Street, on a lot short distance south of his father's residence. "

In 1922, Nora Pratt sold the house to Phillip M. Donohue. Herbert Sweetser, administrator of Phillip Donohue's estate, sold the property to Alice M. Bartlett, of Memorial Drive, Cambridge just 16 months later.

After the death of Alice Bartlett, the property was inherited by her daughter Harriett Bartlett, a social worker living in Cambridge with her mother. Harriett was an investor in land as evident by the real-estate transactions here in town. By 1927, the Pratt paint shop had been torn down and a garage was built on the property to serve the inhabitants of the house. Town Directories do not list inhabitants of 29 Acton road until 1943 when George and Pricilla Linton acquired the property. In the 1940 Federal Census, the Lintons lived on Littleton Rd. A restriction was placed on the garage at the time of the sale from Harriett Bartlett to the Linton family. It appears Harriett was not careful in observing property lines and built a garage partially over the property line. Since Harriet owned the adjacent land it was not a concerned until the sale of 29 Acton Road to the Lintons on Nov. 15, 1962. A special restriction was placed on the garage giving the Linton's a right to




use it and defined notification of issues to both parties. The Lowell Sun published numerous articles about Priscilla Linton, who was very involved in Eastern Star and her church. Pricilla passed away in 1995. George Linton being a mason was very involved in Eastern Star serving as a Worthy Patron. George was also involved with his son George H., Jr., in Demolay, Boy Scouts and the PTA. In 1978, George being unmarried sold the property to himself and his new wife Josephine. George passed away in 1993, both George and his first wife Priscilla are buried in Pine Ridge Cemetery. In 2002, Josephine placed the property in a trust in her name. The trust is now in the hands of Brenda Willette of Tewksbury and very recently, within a few weeks of the completion of this report, was sold.


