



This residence at 41 Billerica Road is typical of many houses built during 1890s in Chelmsford. It is a six roomsingle family house two stories high with a gable roof.

On April 14, 1893 the Lowell Weekly Journal reported that "W.R. Fowle will build this season for his own occupancy on his lot on Billerica street near the premises of Mrs. E.R. Parkhurst." On April 28th "W.R. Fowle has broken ground for his new house on Billerica street." By July 14th "W.R. Fowle's new house on Billerica street is under way. A.W. Holt contractor." November 24, 1893 "William R. Fowle & family expect to occupy their new home on Billerica street in a short time." Mr. Fowle's sister came and stayed every day, watching it being built.

At the time of his marriage to Louise Perham in 1909, William was a carpenter. However, when the house was built, he was raising poultry and later was listed as a "merchant." He continued to raise chickens at his new house, and foundations for his hen houses remain.

Two years after the house was built, on October 9th, 1895, their son William E. Fowle was married, and after a short wedding trip, he and his bride Alice moved in with the elder Fowle family. William E. was a machinist. In 1898/99 he moved to Salisbury; in 1914 he was a resident of Danville, PA.

History

The elder William R. Fowle died on Oct. 22, 1909, due to a cerebral hemorrhage, but his widow, Louisa, remained in the house. During the winter of 1912/13 she stayed with her sister, but reopened the house at 41 Billerica Rd. in March. However, in 1914 the residence was sold and she moved to Bridge St. The new owner was the Rev. L. Leroy Greene, minister of the Unitarian Church. Mr. Greene was very popular and well liked among his parishioners. In 1928 he moved with his wife, Jane, to a "new" pastorate in Waverley. Lucien Burns, principal of the high school, which was then located across the street, resided here for a short time after that, although he was not an owner.

Charles Worthen came from a local family, but he and his wife Clara were residents of Fall River in 1928, when they purchased and moved into 41 Billerica Rd. At that time and for many years he worked in real estate but later worked as an assistant janitor before retiring. He died of cancer in 1941, aged 80 years, and his widow soon moved up the street, to 70 Billerica Road. The property had been mortgaged ten years before, and the bank sold it at public auction to Carl & Angeline Munn of Lowell. There is no record of them living in the house, and a year later the bank again took possession, selling it to G. Wesley and Stella DeBarge. Wesley worked in a mill in Lowell, but after coming to Chelmsford his occupation was that of a musician, a very good pianist. Stella was a seamstress at A.G. Pollard's store in Lowell.

Dick and Mary Lahue became the next owners, moving in with their three children early in 1952. Dick was a carpenter did make some interior changes to the residence. He enclosed a porch following a fire started by one of their sons who placed some firecrackers in the seams of the floor. The next door neighbor dashed over in her nightclothes and came to a window to tell them about the fire. They moved to Worthen St. in 1967, having sold the property to Henry DesRosiers, a salesman, and his wife, Marcelle. Soon after the DesRosiers moved in, they had to replace the double front door. There was police chase down Billerica Rd. during which a bullet went through the door. However, the DesRosiers had thought about putting in a new anyway.

The Cunningham family were living at 41 Billerica Rd. in 1981, when the DesRosiers sold them the property. John W.Cunningham was an engineer and his wife, Margaret, a housewife. They had at least three children, Mary Jane, William, and John J. In 1990 John J., by then a security guard, was still living here with his parents. In 2005 Margaret is still residing at 41 Billerica Rd.

October 1. 1886

Another successful raiser of poultry is Mr. Wm. R. Fowle, who has recently enlarged his accommodations by building a hennery 100 feet by 12, modelled upon the coops of Mr. Hawkins of Lancaster. a recognized authority. The apartments are 12 x 12, and 30 hens are to be kept in each. With Mr. Fowle the Plymouth Rock is the favorite bird, and he has a family of about 600, kept in some ten different localities upon his premises. He finds that the business pays a fair profit, and his sales of eggs have been largely increased by judicious advertising in the Farmers' Exchange, which he will more likely patronize another season.

March 4, 1892

Willie E. Fowle is ill with typhoid fever of a mild type.

[Note by J.B.D.: Mr. Fowle had not yet purchased the property at 41 Billerica Rd.]

April 14, 1893

W. R. Fowle will build this season for his own occupancy a dwelling on his lot on Billerica street near the premises of Mrs. E. R. Parkhurst.

April 28, 1893

W. R. Fowle has broken ground for his new house on Billerica street.

July 14, 1893

W. R. Fowle's new house on Billerica street is under way. A. W. Holt contractor.

November 24, 1893

William R. Fowle & family expect to occupy their new house on Billerica street in a short time.

October 11, 1895

William E. Fowle and Miss Alice W. Perkins were married at Lowell, Tuesday, 9th inst., by Rev. J. M. Greene, D.D. After a short wedding trip the young couple will reside with the groom's parents on Billerica street, and will be home to friends after November 1.

March 30, 1913

Mrs. W. R. Fowle who has passed this winter with her sister, Mrs. W. S. Hall, has reopened her home on Billerica street. Mrs. H. L. Fletcher will be there with her until the completion of her new home in High street.

interior - some changes made

foundation for Mr. Fowle's hen houses were still there the last he knew (except those that slid down the rear back into someone else's yard after Lahue left

front porch:

taken off & replaced with large one at the side

right side:

open porch enclosed by Lahue.

reason: one of their sons placed firecrackers in seams of the floor, & started a fire. Miss Frances Clark lived next door & dashed over in her nightclothes to come to the window & tell them bay window, right of front door: replaced at the same time by a big window with small panes just behind porch was a jut with overhang, where Mr. Fowler backed his wagon into the jut (he was

a butcher). Lahue filled in the jut.

barn:

had a big sliding door, which he replaced with 16 ft. overhead door on right side

rear: was open: closed in by Lahue with stones & cement

3 ft. door & steps (ca 3, 4) put in, which went down due to lay of land

DesRosiers family

double front door: replaced soon after moving in.

during a police chase down Billerica Rd., a bullet went into the double door, so it had to be replaced but they were already thinking about changing it anyway.

barn:

built new stairway toward back of barn, really over old stairs which went down. The new ones went up, where DesRosiers stored/sold medical supplies
