

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

During the 1800s "several families of colored people" lived on "the lane" (now known as Bridge St., named after the 4th minister, Rev. Ebenezer Bridge). A small one story cottage occupied by Peter Fields stood on or near the site of 2 Bridge St. since the 1830s.

Daniel Haley was the first owner of the present house, the erection of the main part (middle) of which was started in 1880 and apparently completed in 1882. However, he and his wife did not actually move in until 1883. Daniel was a "laborer"; he and his wife, Bridget, came here from Dracut but were originally from Ireland.

In 1904 one of their sons, Patrick H. Haley, (Qaniel E. built #230 at 4 Bridge St., and the 3rd brother died as a young man) purchased the house next door at 4 Westford St. (#217). Soon after, parents Daniel & Bridget moved into heir son Patrick's house at 4 Westford St., and Patrick moved into his parents' house at 2 Bridge St. Patrick remained here after inheriting it about 1923 from Daniel.

Patrick H. Haley had a market/variety store in Central Sq. for several years, and between 1918-1939 owned the Odd Fellows Building (#249) with lunch cart beside it (1930-1939). He was appointed by the selectmen as a registrar of voters. He is best remembered, however, as the Chelmsford postmaster. He was the Democratic appointee to this post in Sept. 1, 1913. Two months later he received permission to re-number all post office boxes on both rural routes. His first wife Rose died in 1916, while he was still postmaster. Patrick died of a heart attack in 1951, and in 1957 his widow, Alice, sold the house out of the family.


