Ervin W. Sweetser had this building erected in 1923 on the southwest corner of his house lot (#206). He was the town treasurer and tax collector and for many years ran a meat & provisions store (Sweetser's Market) in the Wilson Block (#204). The building at 10 Chelmsford Street first contained a store and a restaurant, but in 1927 the latter was replaced by the post office. In February 1977 the building is occupied by a hardware store, and an automobile parts store is in the addition on the east side.


