

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The residence at 191 Chelmsford St. is a typical one in Chelmsford built near the turn to the 20th century. It has a ridge roof with the gable facing the front of the building. One tall, narrow chimney, probably the original one, is located in the middle of the original house, at the top of the roof ridge. Two other smaller chimneys are near the rear end of the additions, one on the rear right side of the house and the other on the left. The latter is now closed off; it was used for a stove no longer used. A temporary wooden ramp leads up to the entrance door at the front of the left addition. Built for a single family about 1930 it became a 2 family residence.



HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

Discuss the history of the building. Explain its associations with local (or state) history. Include uses of the building, and the role(s) the owners/occupants played within the community.

In March 1893 Gilbert W. Parker, a mechanic of Lowell, sold to William Scoble the land on which the residence at 191 Chelmsford St. had been built about 3 years earlier, and which the Scobles had been renting.

William and Florence Scoble and their family lived here about 30 years. He was then a mill hand but soon became a "second hand" in Lowell. By 1911 he was working as a carpenter, which he continued to do as long as he lived in the house. The Scobles' son David worked as a "daughtsman", first in Lowell, and later he commuted to Boston. He moved to Fall River in 1917/18 but returned in 1922 with his wife, Blanche. However, David and Blanche only stayed in the home a short period. David's sister Gertrude worked as a stenographer/bookkeeper in Lowell. William, Jr. was employed as a clerk, also in Lowell. In 1925 he married Alecha M. Gooch of Lowell and moved to New York, after which lived at 191 Chelmsford St. with his parents for about 3 years before they moved to Islington. Sometime in the mid 1930s William and Florence Scoble left 191 Chelmsford St. and moved in with his relatives, William & Ethel Scoble , who had a produce stand on North Rd.

HISTORY

By 1943 Gaspard G. & Emma Michaud and their children Roland & Emma were renting part of the house. Gaspard was a weaver A few years later an Army couple came from California and lived in the other side of the house. She was a floor lady.

In Nov. 1948 William & Florence's son, William E. Scoble, Jr., as administrator of his father's estate sold the property to Francis & Lillian Dowd.

By this time Gaspard G. & Emma J. Michaud were renting the entire house from William Scoble. They lived in the front part of the house and were the parents of the people that lived in the rear part.

It was almost two years after purchasing the property before the Dowds could move in. It took about a year before the Michauds could find a new home. The house needed a lot of repairs, and the Dowds bought it for a cheaper price because of all the things that needed to be fixed. Francis & Lillian Dowd did a lot of the work themselves.

When they first moved into the house they got their water from a well outside of the house that was quiet a distance away. There was a water pump which brought the water from that outside well through old water pipes that came into the back corner of the cellar. Later, another water well was located deep in the back part of the cellar. It has long since been filled in, and the rear cellar floor is concrete now.

For several years the family lived in the front of the house, while the rear was rented out.

The first family of renters was Edward and Rachel Vondal, who were here from about 1950 to 1955. "Eddy" worked at the wool mills with Mr. Dowd, and later they both worked as mail carriers at the Chelmsford Post Office. Their children were Cindy, Kenneth, and then Patsy. About the time of Patsy's birth they moved to Stedman St.

The second was a Mrs Hoyle and her son.

The third renter was "Candy" Wilson. She was divorced, had a son, and a neighborhood thief for a dog. He would go off into the neighborhood and would always bring back something that belonged to someone else. It sometimes was a small scatter rug, or a child's toy, or a bucket or mop, a hair brush, gloves, towels -- anything that tickled his fancy. The dog is remembered better than Candy and her son!

The fourth family to rent were Paul and Eileen Peterson and their 2 young children.

Marv & Vincent St. Hilaire lived in rear of 191 Chelmsford St. from 1962 to Nov. 1964. They were the last of the renters. The rent was \$15/ week. Mark & Matthew were both born while they were living there: Mark in May 1962.

Meanwhile, Francis & Lillian Dowd had five children to raise in the house, and the children wanted their own bedrooms. Three bedrooms in the front part of the house were just not enough for 2 adults and 5 children, so after 1964 there were no more families renting space here.

Francis died in 1997, but Lillian remains in the rear section of the house. In the front part live her son John and his wife Gail, with their two children, Michael and Jennifer.

The Dowd family has lived here for almost 60 years.

SETTING

A paved drive runs up along the left side of 191 Chelmsford St.

The ground goes steeply down to a lawn to a lightly wooded area with a very small stream at the rear of the property. Beyond it flows the larger but still small Golden Cove Brook, for which the immediate area is commonly known. Rt. 495 is just beyond that brook. Two storage sheds and a garage are located to the right of the house. The garage is situated 21 feet from the house.

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
