

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION see continuation sheet Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other building According to the Inspector of Buildings records, 280 Chelmsford Street is a building that has not undergone renovations. It is a basic Victorian design called a "Four Square", with a porch along the front of the house. The house has 2 stories, a centered front door, a stone foundation, clapboard siding and a hip roof. The house is in extremely poor condition, the present owner has left it open to the elements, removed the windows, partially gutter the interior, appears to have left holes in the roof and in general has been responsible for demolition by neglect. HISTORICAL NARRATIVE see continuation sheet Discuss the history of the building. Explain its associations with local (or state) history. Include uses of the building, and the role(s) the owners/occupants played within the community. In 1896, Henry S. Perham had a large parcel of land surveyed and subdivided to form a development called "The Westlands", the development today is still known as "the Westlands". In 1899, Kate Scullin, a Scottish immigrant who was later to become Katherine Riley, bought Lot #2 for \$1.00 and other considerations. Through the years Katherine Riley would purchase Lots 1, 3 & 4. In 1909 Katherine Riley boult 1280 Chelmsford Street in the very
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popular and livable "four square" plan of the late Victorian Era. The 1910 Census notes that Katherine, her husbar Frank, an Irish immigrant working as a clerk in a meat store, her father with his own income and a brother, a weaver all lived in the house. The 1920 Census shows Catherine and Frank Riley living with their daughter Bertha, father law Joseph Scollin, a cotton mill operator and a Mary Degnan, sister-in-law. In 1940, Frank and Katherine Riley state house to William Hogan, a single gentleman of Lowell. Between 1940 and 1947, the house passed from one family member to another, always returning to Frank C. Riley until his death in 1950. Katherine Riley died in 1940 both Frank and Katherine Riley are buried in St. Patrick's Cemetery in Lowell, MA. In August 1947 the house past to Mary Scollin. Dorothy Scollin, a sister bought the house in 1985, and it did not change hands again until it was purchased by Mark Callahan and Stacey Alcorn in April 2005. For the next 2 years it was apparently used as a reproperty until it was purchased by Cuong Bui. In October of 2007, Cuong Bui requested to demolish 280 Chelms Street.







Locational Information




