9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

On May 25, 1894 Leroy J. Parkhurst bought the land from the All Saints' Parish and immediately deeded it to Julia S. Ripley. These deeds specified that "no intoxicating liquor to be used as a beverage shall be sold thereon." Less than a month later he bagan construction of the building, the work being done by J.L. Douglass. By Aug. 1894 the building was occupied; one room by Leroy Parkhurst "for his tailoring business, which requires two or three assistants; the other by William H. Baker, who has neatly fitted up the room for shaving and hair cutting, in which he has several years experience." Mr. Parkhurst also lived in the building.

In 1901 the Ripleys deeded the property back to Leroy Parkhurst, who continued his tailoring business and residence there. In 1911 the wooden flooring and steps of the 40 foot piazza in front of the house were torn out and replaced with cement; work was done by the Staples Bros. In 1945 the building was sold by Leroy Parkhurst's widow to the present owners.




