

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings within the community.

The house is located on a small rise overlooking the intersection of North Road (Route 4) and Davis Road. The T-plan house is oriented toward North Road to the east. The rectangular lot is planted in grass with mature trees near the perimeter of the lot. A wide paved driveway leads from Davis Road to the attached garage at the west end of the house.

The house has been extensively altered since it was last surveyed in 2005. It appears that the original house has been retained. The ell, however, has been removed and replaced with new construction that is similar in volume and size to its predecessor, if not materials or details.

The original house is the side-gabled block facing North Road. The block is five bays wide; the side elevations have been altered to now contain two bays of windows instead of one. Windows and doors throughout the original block are recent replacements that match the new construction at the ell. Details removed include the Greek Revival architrave located at the main entrance and paired Italianate cornice brackets.

A two-story, two-part ell extends from the rear of the west (rear) elevation. The center section has a gable roof with overhanging eaves. The west section of the ell has an asymmetrical gable roof with a cross-gabled dormer on the south elevation above the two garage bays. The ell rests on a poured concrete foundation. A shed-roof porch extends along the eastern two thirds of the south elevation (*i.e.*, along the main block and the east end of the ell.). The porch is supported by square-section posts and a wood floor. Windows and doors are of recent construction, consistent with the age of the ell.


