9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house was built within a year from June 1845, when Charles Swett purchased the land from Lincoln Drake, the iron founder of Easton and North Chelmsford. A native of New Hampshire, Mr. Swett worked as a laborer and sexton in North Chelmsford. In 1861 he died of typhoid fever, while under the medical care of his next door neighbor, Dr. Nathan B. Edwards. Three of his children, John F., Anna Maria, and Charles E., deeded their portion of the property to Arthur H. Sheldon, husband of their sister, Sarah Emeline.

Arthur H. Sheldon was a prominent resident of North Chelmsford, serving as selectman for eight times between 1880 and 1899. He was a moulder by occupation. Following his

death in 1911, his widow remained in the house until her own death in 1927.

In 1935 the property was sold, ending 90 years of Swett/Sheldon family ownership.


