

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

In December 1843 Oliver Cummings purchased his house lot from Lincoln Drake, and the building was erected the following year. Little is known about Oliver; he was born in Dunstable in 1801 and died of pneumonia in North Chelmsford in 1880. A year and a half after his wife Rebecca died from cancer in 1861, he sold the house to Miss Mary Hollis, who remained here until her death in 1889. From then until 1930 it was under large mill ownership, first by George C. Moore, and later by the United States Worsted Corporation.


