

#### **DESIGN ASSESSMENT**

Describe important design features and evaluate in terms of other structures within the community.

The flagpole is a solid wood, painted pole that was originally used as a ship mast. The pole was shortened by approximately one-third when it was relocated to the site in 2013. It is set in concrete with a small gravel surround. Pegs on the sides of the pole permit access to a small, grated landing. A second narrower wood pole is attached to the top of the pole. Metal flagpole hardware and rope were installed on the mast for it to be used as a flagpole.

The structure retains historic integrity of materials, feeling, and association.

### **HISTORICAL NARRATIVE**

Explain the history of the structure and how it relates to the development of the community.

The mast was installed in the Chelmsford Town Common in 1903 and was used for this purpose until ca. 2013. At this date the Town decided to replace the pole with a modern flagpole. In order to save the flagpole from demolition, the Garrison House Association assumed responsibility for the pole and moved it to its current location on the property.
