William and Fanny Mitchell had no children, and six years before her death in 1943, the widow sold the property to a neice, Ethel R. Hagerman. She in turn sold in 1959, ending 71 years of family ownership.

For several years around 1920-30 Mrs. Mitchell and her neice, Mrs. Edith Hemenway, ran a business in Chelmsford Center called "The Cookie Jar", selling baked goods, and, at Christmas-time fruit cake, Christmas




