

In December, 1877 Daniel W. Lane purchased the land for \$600, and by the next year the house at 94 High Street had been erected. He and his wife Mary resided here. Five years later the property sold and was then occupied for a few years by renters. Ormand A. Whitaker and his wife did reside here from 1884 until sometime after 1905. They moved to Lowell, where he died. In 1910 his heirs sold 94 High Street to Darius M. Edwards, who was also then living in Lowell. He was a farmer and lived here with his wife Laura until his death in January 1918 of acute lobar pneumonia and his widow sold the same year to the Wentworth family. Charles Wentworth resided here until 1924, when he too moved to Lowell. In 1940 Harry and Ethel Leighton moved in as renters, having purchased the property in 1928 but sold it 1939. Harry Leighton was a registered pharmacist. They only stayed here one year, and the owners, Roger & Emma Gage, moved here from Lowell, beginning 37 years of Gage/Runels/Charlton family owner/occupancy. Roger W. Gage, a realty manager, and his wife Emma were not young when they came here, and Roger died in 1949. In Dec. 1947, 2 years before his death, the house "was badly damaged by smoke this morning at 7:15 o'clock when the oil burner flooded and oil which ran out on the cellar floor, became ignited. The Center fire company, in charge of District Chief Allan Kidder, made short work of the flames but smoke damage had been done when the company arrived." Roger died in April 1949, and the "impressive funeral" was held in the residence. It was largely represented by many organizations, including the Lowell Council of Boy Scouts and the Lowell Realtors Association. His 70 year old widow continued to reside at 94 High St. In 1957 her brother, George Runels, and his wife Anna, came to live with her. Emma Gage and George Runels had been born in Lowell of parents who came there from Vermont. Emma Gage died June 30th, 1967, age 90. She had been associated with her church Women's group, the DAR, Middlesex Women's Club and

#### HISTORY

Jane Charlton, a social worker and daughter of Emma & Roger Gage, and her husband, Robert, a construction engineer., moved to 94 High Street from Southgate Rd. in the latter part of 1969. They resided there with their son, Anthony, a student, until 1975 or 6. Jane remarried and in Oct. 1976 she, Jane Charlton Commorant sold the property to Daniel & Carole Gillette, who had been living on Hillside Lane. At that time Dan sold real estate and Carole was a teacher's aide. Dan soon became a loan officer for a bank, and Carole took up selling real estate. They resided at 94 High Street for almost 20 years with their children, Dan Jr., David, Donna, and Jennifer. It was sold in 1995. The present owner/occupants have lived here since 2001

Chelmsford Newsweekly, April 14, 1949 Impressive Funeral Services Tuesday For Roger Gage

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon for Roger W. Gage, widely known local realty manager, at his residence, 94 High Street, at 1:00 p.m. The largely attended services were conducted by Rev. Mason F. McGinness, pastor of the First Grace Universalist church. Appropriate organ prelude and postlude music was played by William Hoyle, the organist.

There were many organizations of which Mr. Gage was affiliated with, represented at the services, by delegates. The Lowell Realtors association was represented by John H. Murphy, Lewis P. Smith and M. Edward Riney of Chelmsford. The Lowell Council, Boy Scouts of America, was represented by Hal R. Kellogg, executive secretary, William D. Large.

The bearers were Robert E. Charlton, a son-in-law, and Henry M. Cooke, William M. DeMallie and Herbert W. Jones Jr., all nephews of Mr. Gage.

Burial took place in the family lot in Lowell cemetery where the committal prayers were read by Rev. McGinness. Arrangements were in charge of Funeral Director Robert T. Morse.

Chelmsford Newsweekly, July 6, 1967 Mrs. Emma Gage

Mrs. Emma (Runels)Gage, 90, of 94 High St., Center section, died June 30. She was the widow of Roger W. Gage. Mrs. Gage was born in Lowell, the daughter of the late Henry and Martha (Morrill) Runels and had made her home in this city until establishing her residence in Chelmsford 28 years ago. She is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Robert T. Charlton (Jane), of Chelmsford; a sister, Mrs. Charles I. Cooke (Bertha) of Lowell; a brother, George Runels of Chelmsford; two grandsons, Robert T. Charlton, 111, and Anthony Gage Charlton, both of Chelmsford. Mrs. Gage was a member of the First Grace Universalist Church of Lowell and was associated with the Women's Group of that parish. She also held membership in Molly Varnum Chapter, DAR; the Middlesex Women's Club and was a member of the Governing Board of the Old Ladies Home of Lowell. Services were held at the Morse Funeral Home Monday afternoon, Internment in Lowell Cemetery, Lowell. Funeral Directors Robert T. Morse.

Mrs. Anna (Greenwood) Runels, wife of George H. Runels of 94 High St., Center section, formerly of Lowell. died on May 10. She was born in Lowell Sept. 28, 1878, the daughter of Randolph A. and Annie (Whitenact) Greenwood Beside her husband, she is survived by several nieces and nephews. Mrs. Runels was a member of the Women's Association of the Lowell General Hospital, the Lowell Girls Club, the Lowell Visiting Nurses Association, Lowell Chapter, American Red Cross, the Greater Lowell Council of Girl Scouts, and a former member of the Middlesex Women's Club. Services were held Monday afternoon at the Blake Memorial Funeral Home. Internment was in the Lowell Cemetery. Funeral Directors Cortlandt J. Burkinshaw and F. Warren Johnston.

Chelmsford Newsweekly, July 16, 1970 GEORGE H. RUNELS

George H. Runels a former resident of Lowell and Clearwater, Florida, but for the past 14 years making his home in Chelmsford, died Monday evening at the Chelmsford House. Born September 3, 1875 in Lowell, the son of Henry and Martha Jane (Morrill) Runels, he was prominently identified with the civic and business life of Lowell for many years. He was the proprietor of the Adams Hardware Company and later served as Vice President of the Appleton National Bank. Active in the Lowell Rotary Club, he was the only living charter member and was honored at their 50th Anniversary on May 8, 1970. He was also a member or the Vesper Country Club, the Mt. Pleasant Golf Club and the Masonic Fraternity. He is survived by four nieces, Mrs. Francis J. Safford, of Peterborough, N.H., Mrs. William W. DeMall1e of Kennebunkport, Maine, formerly of Lowell, Mrs. Robert T. Charlton of Chelmsford and Mrs. Arthur Short of Millis and a nephew, Henry M. Cook of Kennebunkport, Maine, formerly of Lowell. 
