

The house was then sold and rented to Eric Carlson, a stone cutter at the nearby granite quarry. According to a neighbor who was then a very young boy, Fred Burne, the house became "pretty ramshackled". In the fall of 1921 George King, a carpenter, and his wife, Ellen, purchased the house and probably were the owners who fixed up the house. In 1926 the Kings moved to New York State and sold the property to Anthony & Eline/Ellen Miller, who apparently had been renting the house. Anthony Miller was an auto mechanic and later a comber until his death in 1950. Ellen remained in the house, until marrying Wilbur McCrady and moved to Lowell. However, they soon returned to 231 Main St. After Mr. McCrady died, Ellen shared the house with various people, including a painter and his wife, and elderly LPN, and her son Charles Miller, a shovel operator, and his wife Barbara.

In 1979 Mrs. Eline/Ellen Miller/McCrady sold to James and Mary Pearson, who remained there for the next 13 years. Jim Pearson is an engineer, and is in 2004 the Chelmsford Town Engineer. Mary is an RN. They resided there with their three daughters. The current owners, Andrew and Mary Wilson, purchased the house in 1992. He is a real estate broker and she a business analyst.




