ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

This "Folk Victorian" style house sits about 20 feet from the street and the front façade faces the northeast. The main body of the house is 22 x 30 feet with a 12 x 18 foot, 2 story wing attached to the southeast end of the house. Centered on the rear of the house is another 18 x 13 foot addition and attached to that is an open porch same as the front porch and a deck. All windows are 2/1 with a simple cornice and narrow friezes. All door frames match the windows unless stated otherwise. The steeple pitched roof line runs front to back with a gabled wing on the south, rear. The simple cornice boards are narrow with corner returns and scroll brackets on the peak.

The front façade of the house faces the northeast. There is a one story 13 x 8 foot, flat roofed, open one story porch half the width of the house. The porch has the typical turned corner posts with decorative brackets, rails supported by slender spindle balusters and 5 wooden stairs to the front walk. The porch itself has a heavy square post wooden support frame. The door is located at the top of the stairs and at this time has a full glass storm door. On the northerly side of the front façade is a 2 story, 3 bay window supported by a dressed granite stone foundation indicating it is part of the original structure. The roof of the second floor bay is flat with the same simple façade. Adjacent to the second floor bay on the south side is a single window unit. There is a single window in the peak.

The north façade has an external, used brick chimney running from the foundation to above the roof line. The second floor has a single window unit on the street side of the chimney and a pair of windows with matched locations on both floors on the southerly end of the house.

The southerly façade has a two story blank wall with an equal sided diamond shaped window between floors indicating a stair case. The two story 8x12 foot wing has single windows on all 3 sides. The wing has a dressed granite foundation indicating it was built as part of the original house.

The southerly façade has an 18x13 foot ell and a 13x15 foot open porch on the westerly side of the ell. The porch has the same architectural features as the one on the front. There is a more modern deck attached to the rear of the house. Detailed plans at the building department do not extend that far back. Tax records to not indicate any large additions

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

In 1902, Mrs. Emma M. Adams, widow of C.W.S. Adams, a prominent business man and land owner living in North Chelmsford, represented her son Manzur Adams, a minor, in the sale of 2 lots of land in a planned subdivision. (1) The village of North Chelmsford was all about the wool mills and growing rapidly. This 48 acre parcel of land was subdivided into long narrow 92 x 250-foot lots. (2) The shape of the lots indicates the community was becoming more reliant on the local trolley system eliminating the need for horses, barns and carriage houses. In an effort to keep the neighborhood neat and orderly, Mrs. Adams placed a restriction upon the lots; no house was to be built less than 20 feet from the street, houses had to be at least 2 stories high and no barns, sheds or other buildings were to be erected closer than 50 feet from the street. (3) The lots attracted families of skilled labor, labor for the mills and granite quarries along with the people needed to provide services.

In 1902, Frederick Gaudette, an immigrant from Canada and a machinist in the local worsted wool mill, purchased 2 lots of land with a total 11,552 square feet (4), with his wife, Lucy. He built his new house in 1903 (5), on Ripley Street, making it a very brief walk from his home to the wool mill. The 1910 Federal Census shows Fred and Lucy lived in the house with Lucy's parents and a servant. After selling the house in 1911, Fred and Lucy moved to Los Angeles where Fred stared to work as a "ship fitter" at the L.A. Ship and Dry Dock Co. located in San Pedro. At the age of 43 years, Fred registered for the World War I Draft (6). Fred survived the war and when he passed away in 1954, he was buried in Los Angeles (7).

On December 6, 1911, Fred and Lucy sold their house to a young couple, Charles F. and wife Edith Hoelzel. In the 1920 Federal Census, Charles worked at the local wool mill as a "wool sorter" to support his wife and their 4 children (8) and on April 27, 1942, like many other Americans, Charles filed his World War II Registration Card (9). At the time, the 52 year old Charles was living

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on Ripley Street but was working for the Hudson Worsted Co, Hudson, Mass. After the war in 1945, the Hoelzels sold the house to Charles F. and Alice H. Dinnigan (10), the houses most well-known residents.

In the 1946 Chelmsford Voter Registration List, Charles is listed as a 37 year old contractor that had moved from around the corner on Washington Street (11). His wife Alice was a mill worker (12). The 1950 Federal Census listed Charles as a "wool comber" working for the local South Wells Wool Co. in North Chelmsford (13). Charles or Charlie, as he was called, had a passion for bowling. The Lowell Sun Newspaper (14) has many years of articles celebrating Charlie's success in bowling both local and state competitions. The Lowell Sun reports Charlie was appointed by the Board of Selectman in 1947 to serve on the Lowell Civil Court (15). While living in the house, Charlie and his wife saw their son Robert join the Air Force and their 2 daughters Charlotte and Norma married. (16) Charlie passed away in 1986 and Alice passed before him. Their grave stone reveals their love of music and Charlie's passion for bowling by the bowling pins and G Cleft carved on their stone. Charlie was the founder of the North Chelmsford Duck Pin Alley. His small 5 lane alley is still located in the basement of the building it was founded. Many a senior remembers setting pins during games and the bowling alley still is busy with bowling leagues and birthday parties.

In 1987, the Executors of Charles F. Dinnigan's estate sold the house to Frank W., Jr. and Cathy Taylor, Husband and wife (17). The house has changed hands several times since.

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
