

This house was built in 1904 by Edward J. Robbins on the site of the former garden of the Packard house (#29). Edward Robbins was in the real estate and insurance business with his father (Martin Robbins & Son, 45 Merrimack St., Lowell). He also served as the town clerk. The present owner is his daughter.

During his term as town clerk, the office and town vault were in the house, in the front right room.





- 3. Mrs. Margaret Robbins Mills: 8/18/1974 & 3/13/1972 This house was built in 1903. Edwin R. Clark was the architect (he was an inventor of whistles; invented the first whistle on the town hall - not the whistle there in 1974.) Almon Holt was the contractor (considered the best builder in town).

If you stand in front of 16 Westford Street (built in 1793 in the socalled Georgian or Federal manner) and look at the windows & general outline of the house, it is rather interesting. It is quite beautifully proportioned and the windows are 6 over 6 panes of glass, which was the proper thing to have at that time. Now look at 12 Westford St. which was designed by the well known Chelmsford Architect, Edwin Clark, and she the transition to plate glass. This house is kind of half way between, so you have panes of 6 glass in the upper sash and the single pane in the lower sash. This house (#12) had a piazza from one end of the house across the front to the other side - now these are removed and only the portico over the front door remains. Look at the woodwork and pillars there - very beautifully proportioned to the house as a whole, and the eye goes up to the railing and piazza on the 2nd floor where the flagpole comes out, and find there a Chippendale type of opening in a break in the straight up & down pieces of the railing. Hopefully we'll get the railing back up around the top on the roof. It had more of the Chippendale open work. As your eye goes up, everything looks a little lighter. Now look at 8 Westford St. This house had no architect but instead a contractor, and he was compiling ideas from these other two houses. Here see plate glass windows, piazza out of

proportion to the whole - raised up with much shubbery in front of it, and there is a proponderance of pillars, but this goes along with the plate glass. Showing more affluence, I suppose. Shift back to 16 Westford St. and see what 200 years can do in the manner of architecture. #8 & #12 are built on property that originally went with #16 Westford St. Chelmsford Directory 1898-99 Robbins. Edward J. - boards Martin Robbins' Robbins. Martin (Robbins & Sweetser), Bridge near Westford, house ditto. (Martin Robbins & Herbert Sweetser - windmill agents) 1915-16 Robbins. Edward J. - town clerk also (Martin Robbins & Son, 45 Merrimack. Lowell). house Westford road near Worthen. 1922 Robbins. Edward J. (Christina A.) (Martin Robbins & Son. 45 Merrimack Lowell), house Westford road near Worthen. Lowell Courier-Citizen July 29, 1910 - Garages for George W. Day and Edward J. Robbins at the rear of their residences on Westford street are nearly complete. Enslie Mills, Feb. 15, 1977: Edward J. Robbins - was in real estate and insurance business with his father. Martin Robbins. Piazza - was only an open wooden floor porch, which went across the frant of the house; done before Enslie came in 1930 - but he would guess it was taken off (and replaced with present portico) around 1920. Railing (balustrade) around roof - he took it off about 1955 but replaced it in 1976. No other alterations to the house that he remembers. 12 Westford St. house - built in former garden of the Packard house
