

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This residence was built on land purchased from Deacon David Perham, one of Chelmsford's early "housing developers." Since its erection in 1881, the house has undergone little or no modernization. It's first owner, Lyman S. Gale, was at one time a highway surveyor. He sold the house in 1888 to Mrs. Melbourn F. Hutchins (Julia M.) of Westford, and it was rented out for a few months to Charles Vinal of Framingham. After the turn of the century, it was owned by a machinist; in 1921 it was purchased by Frank W. Smith, a Lowell leather worker, and it remained in his family until about 1974. A daughter, Clara Smith, became an invalid, and a hydraulic elevator was installed for her use in what is now (1977) a closet in the kitchen. Maude Weatherbee was hired by the Smiths as a housekeeper and to take care of Clara; in 1947 Clara deeded half of the house to Maude, who survived Clara.






